Recently, I was fortunate to work on a production of the musical *Rent* at Quad City Music Guild. It was an incredible experience, and I'm so grateful for the opportunity. The most well-known song from the musical is "Seasons of Love". The song reflects on the passage of time over the course of one year. Until I listened to the lyrics, I never knew that there are quite literally 525,600 minutes over the course of a year; a wildly remarkable number when you think about it.

At HDC, we pack a lot into 525,600 minutes that make up each year. Remember, HDC never shuts down. We have two residential programs that operate 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, 365 days each year; not to mention the operations for Daily Discovery, HDC Enterprises, Community Employment, and other service-related programming offered. The number of participants served, the programs offered daily, the projects in process, and the daily operation of the agency is a staggering amount of work packed into a year. Fortunately, we have a dedicated team of employees who work daily to fill those 525,600 minutes each year and provide the full menu of services that HDC offers to support the population at the heart of our mission.

In addition to all the activity surrounding services, there are always a vast number of projects taken on each year too. As we shift to the season of spring, we are beginning to see some of those projects come to fruition. Elsewhere in this newsletter, you can read

Projects Update

Several important projects at HDC have been in the planning stages for a while, and many generous people and organizations made contributions to bring these projects to life. Here is an update on the progress to date:

Residential Center Front Entrance

Work is nearly complete on the addition to provide a more functional and spacious front entrance to the Residential Center. As with so many construction projects, this one too encountered a few delays along the way, but it will soon be ready for use. The project included removing and repouring new concrete under the canopy, adding two new wheelchair ramps to provide access into the new space from either side of the entrance, enclosing the space with tempered glass, and installing automatic sliding doors. Residents are preparing to enjoy the additional climate-controlled area that will provide a more relaxed environment and a more welcoming space.

Safety and Security

Ensuring everyone is safe and all locations are secure are top priorities at HDC. Over the past few years, many procedures and systems have been put into place in an effort to address safety and security. However, more work was needed. Recently, updated camera systems were installed to provide clearer pictures, and additional cameras were added inside the buildings' common areas to capture photos of any intruders. New lock systems were added to key areas to improve safety, and Residential Center wing doors received updated alarms. A security expert is currently assessing all HDC locations, and any areas needing improvement will be addressed at the conclusion of the audit.

Poised and ready to start a Wii bowling competition, Colin Fye and Tia Bullock are anxious to see how their classroom will look after the makeover is complete.

Dayhab Reimagined

Daily Discovery West is targeted to receive a big makeover this year. With the goal to provide a more engaging and sensory stimulating environment for participants who attend day services at the Hickory Grove Road building, the hallways and classrooms will see some changes. Plans are currently being developed that will include spaces that are not only functional, but fun. No walls will be removed, nor other major renovations done. Instead, the spaces will be revamped to ensure participants who may attend services in these spaces for years will find them interesting and enjoyable. Preliminary plans have been shared, so cost estimates will soon be available. Work on this project will begin later this year.

“We are very grateful for everyone who has recognized the importance of these initiatives and generously supported them,” said HDC President/CEO Jeff Ashcraft. As the projects move forward, information will continue to be shared. In the meantime, all are welcome to plan a visit and learn more. Contact HDC at 563-391-4834.

A new residential option is coming to HDC, which will offer participants an opportunity to live in a supportive, family setting where they can gain independence and form strong, lasting friendships. The Host Home program engages people who are willing to open their homes and hearts to help others. They are carefully matched with individuals who experience intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. Host Home arrangements provide a private home experience for individuals while also offering support and companionship. In return, the home providers enjoy the satisfaction of making a positive difference in another person's life, while receiving a generous tax-free monthly stipend. People who decide to be home providers have many different reasons for making that decision. Some are “empty nesters” with a little extra room. Some are families who want to welcome another person into their home. Some are single people who enjoy helping others.

A Quarterly Snapshot: Residential Center and Group Homes

Progress, Not Perfection

“Progress, not perfection” is a popular phrase that emphasizes the importance of continuously making progress toward a goal, rather than striving for perfection. The phrase helps to focus on moving forward, making steady improvements over time, and learning. It is a phrase that describes the Residential Center (RC), which faces challenges but regardless of those challenges, provides a wonderful home for its 54 residents.

Despite staffing shortages that so many places are experiencing, the RC makes sure residents have many opportunities to participate in a variety of activities that bring them joy and excitement. They eagerly await the chance to be pampered with a fresh manicure, engage in lively discussions with fellow book lovers, and enjoy musical talents from visiting artists. Not only do these activities provide entertainment and relaxation, they foster a sense of friendship among the residents.

Staffing issues are experienced nearly everywhere right now, but the residential programs feel the pinch more than most. With taxing job duties and challenging work schedules, Residential Center jobs are not for everyone. However, progress is being made by implementing new and innovative ways to attract and retain qualified staff members who provide excellent care.

Projects that enhance the quality of life for the residents are also in progress. The expanded front entrance will be a welcoming addition to the building and a beautiful space for residents to enjoy.

A recently acquired wheelchair scale is also progress. While a new weigh scale may seem mundane, having the ability to routinely monitor weights ensures the well-being of the residents and can be done in a more efficient, safe and respectful way.

Ensuring progress toward having the right people in the right place, the Residential Center has welcomed a familiar face to the leadership team. Justin DeBaker moved from a Wing Supervisor to the RC Program Director to work alongside Tiffany Sprague, the RC’s Vice President. Brainstorming with the team to find solutions to issues is what he believes best serves the participants. “Every job has challenges and this one is no different. For me, whatever challenges arise are wholly overshadowed by the profound nature of this profession and my opportunity to make a real difference in the lives of some spectacular human beings,” says Justin.

By hiring and retaining quality employees, by making facility improvements, by utilizing staff’s talents to better serve the residents, the RC has made significant progress in achieving its goals, which is to improve and enhance lives. Of course, there is still work to be done to address challenges. The RC will continue to innovate and collaborate to build on successes and learn from setbacks to create a better home for all and to work toward progress, not perfection.

 - Individuals were offered choices – (RC) **3.6** and (GH) **3.5**
 - Individuals were overall satisfied with services – (RC) **4.0** and (GH) **3.8**
- Participants maintained or increased their health status – (RC) **100%** and (GH) **98%**
