# Knee Deep -**A New Perspective**

In February of this year, I underwent total knee replacement surgery on my right knee, and then did it all over again on the left knee in April. "Kneedless" to say, it has been an enlightening journey, reshaping not only my physical capabilities but also my appreciation for the Empowering Abilities mission and the participants we serve daily. As I grappled with the pain and limitations of recovery, I found myself immersed in a world where many of our folks live each and every day-

a world where simple tasks become monumental challenges.

Before my surgeries, I took my mobility for granted. Walking, standing, even working out were effortless actions. But suddenly, I was thrust into a reality where every movement was a struggle, every step a victory. The helplessness I felt, at times, was overwhelming. Relying on others for basic needs, feeling the sting of vulnerability, and confronting the emotional weight of my limitations were humbling experiences. These moments of frustration, though temporary for me, are a

constant battle for many of our participants and their families.

This journey has ignited a deeper empathy within me. I see more clearly the courage and resilience in those who face intellectual and physical difficulties daily. Their strength in the face of adversity is nothing short of inspiring. It's not just about providing assistance; it's about offering genuine compassion and understanding A kind word, a gentle touch, a moment of patience, these small acts of love can transform someone's day, offering them a glimmer of hope and dignity. It can be the difference between achieving a simple goal and giving up.

Moreover, my experience has underscored the critical need for accessibility and inclusivity. Physical spaces, communication methods, and social interactions should be designed with inclusivity at their core. Everyone deserves the chance to participate fully in life, and it's our collective mission to dismantle the barriers that stand in the way of our participants.

These knee surgeries have been a catalyst for profound change in my approach to serving our mission. They have taught me the true meaning of empathy and patience. As I continue to heal, I am committed to using this experience to advocate for and support those who face these challenges daily. We can build a world that is not only accessible but also filled with compassion and understanding. My mission is clear, transforming empathy into action, and ensuring that every participant, regardless of their abilities, can live a life of dignity and fulfillment so that they may succeed, achieve, grow and to be happy.

# Vendor Spotlight: Edwards Creative -**Designing Joy, One** Room at a Time

At Empowering Abilities, we believe every space should tell a story-and thanks to the creative vision of our partners at Edwards Creative, our Hickory Grove Road location now tells a vibrant, joyful one.

What began with a sketch and a conversation became a multi-phase transformation, driven by a shared commitment to inclusion, creativity, and purpose.

#### A Partnership Built on Purpose

Over a series of months, Empowering Abilities and Edwards Creative met to develop a conceptual planmapping out objectives, envisioning the participant experience, and outlining a design approach that would bring warmth and inspiration into the space. Their goal? To ensure everyone who entered felt better walking in-and even better walking out.

From those early sketches, the project evolved into a room-by-room redesign that unfolded over 12-14 months. Edwards Creative took a stair-step approach to design and production, carefully customizing each space to reflect Empowering Abilities' mission and the individuality of the people we serve.

#### More Than a Makeover

The project culminated in a joyful lunch celebration-with Hungry Hobo sandwiches, high-fives, and heartfelt reflections-bringing together the full Edwards Creative team and Empowering Abilities staff. But what came after the ribbon cutting was even more impactful

For the team at Edwards, the work sparked something bigger. "It reminded everyone involved that the work we do has real impact," shared Tim Wren, Director of Sales & Museum Services for Edwards Creative. "Our installers, Aryn and



Austin, formed real connections with participantsgreeted with smiles, high-fives, and even hugs as they moved through the building. It was more than a project; it was a relationship."

#### An Uplifting Ripple Effect

The project has inspired others as well. When Camp Courageous visited Empowering Abilities, they were so moved by the transformation that they asked Edwards Creative to reimagine several of their own cabins. The result? A warm, welcoming space that feels far from institutional-just like our vision here

"It's similar to the hospital projects we've done," Tim added. "We prioritize how people feel when they walk in. Our job is to help them feel better, more supported, more seen."

While the physical transformation was designed for our participants, the process also brought renewed energy to staff on both sides. "It was

invigorating, fun, and creative," Tim said. "Our team left inspired—and grateful for the chance to work alongside such passionate people."
